

Report on National Seminar

'Multiple Roles of Teacher: The Need for Sustainable Society'

Army Institute of Education organised a One day National Seminar on 06 March 2017 on the topic '**Multiple Roles of Teacher: The Need for Sustainable Society**'. Presenters have contributed to the body of knowledge through their paper presentations & discussions on the following sub themes.

1. New Vistas in Education in Futuristic Society: 2050
2. Inculcating Values and Life Skills for the Sustainable Society
3. Integration of ICT Skills in 21st Century Education
4. Empowerment Initiatives and Developing Employable Skills

Total 77 guests attended the Seminar out of which 06 Principals, 12 Faculty from various Teacher Training Institutes, 22 school teachers, 16 Research Scholars and 12 teacher trainees from various colleges attended the event. (Annex Attch)

Inaugural Session was graced by Ms Veena Naravane, President (Regional) AWWA Delhi, as Special Guest, Prof Sangeeta Chauhan, Dean, University School of Education, GGSIPU, New Delhi, as Guest of Honour, Ms Suzanne Rodricks, Phase Head, Foundation Stage and lower primary, Dubai Scholars Private School, Dubai, as Keynote Speaker, and Maj Gen Rajesh Sahai, AVSM, SM, Chairman AIE.

The welcome address was given by Dr Saksham Singh, Principal AIE , she welcomed the guests and focussed on details and achievements of AIE.

Ms Naravane spoke about the fundamental nature of children and the Socrates method of teaching. Teachers are not just imparters of knowledge but have multiple roles and responsibilities at different stages of life, which play a crucial role in the development of the children as a complete person.

Prof Chauhan praised the discipline of wards of Army Personnel. She spoke about moralistic values, ethics and inbuilt discipline of children. She emphasised on the importance of multi tasking in the field of education. She mentioned that this topic of sustainable education is highly placed in every subject, starting from History, Psychology, Philosophy and Sociology. Even Inclusive education talks about sustainable society and education.

Ms Suzanne reiterated on the transitory role of a teacher, a comparison between the present and past picture of a teacher. She spoke about book of Gardener 'Five Minds' and its valuable content including- collecting information, organisation of information, creative mind, respectful, unbiased and ethical mind. She focussed on developing the skill sets of the students as per their abilities.

Technical Session I – The session was chaired by Prof Dhananjay Joshi, Professor, University School of Education, GGSIPU, who focussed on teachers as the role model and who can make the child well equipped to deal with the new situations in life. Session was Co-chaired by Dr Manhar Charan, Assistant Professor, HOD (Value Education), Deptt of Education, IASE, Rajasthan, who questioned the vision in 2017 for sustainable growth of society in 2050. 17 presenters presented their papers in this session. They emphasized on the core life skills, both interpersonal and intrapersonal, which can be inculcated in the students through value integrated education. They also focussed on the role of teachers who can mould the future generation for sustainability, which is of highest priority in today's generation.

Technical Session II – The session was chaired by Prof Jessy Abraham, Professor, IASE, Jamia Milia Islamia, New Delhi. She focussed on all the concern areas like critical thinking, questioning, learning by doing among the students and the influence the teachers have on their students which is not limited till the classroom only. Co-chairperson Dr Shipra Vaidya, Professor of Commerce, Dept of Education and Social Sciences, NCERT, put forward the difference between theoretical text and ground reality. She pointed on various schemes which focus on developing employment skills. Co- chairperson Dr Sachin Vashishtha, Assistant Professor, Hindu College, Delhi University, emphasised on the role of ICT in moderation and transition in today’s classroom. 18 presenters presented their papers in this session. According to their views sustainable development is sustainable only when there is a transition of society. Relevant learning among all stake holders will accelerate this transition whose core areas are Inclusion, Cooperation and Resilience. Grass root level intervention starting from the school level is required for the transition. Enhancing employable skills through education will equip the coming generation to be a part of the futuristic society.
