WORKSHOP ON “PROMOTING INTERGENERATIONAL BONDING”

Army Institute of Education organized a **workshop on “Promoting Intergenerational Bonding”** in association with **All India Women's Education Fund Association (AIWEFA)** in collaboration with **National Institute of Social Defence, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India** on 31 January 2019. The workshop was attended by the student-teachers of both batches as well as the faculty members of AIE. The purpose was to inculcate the value of intergenerational harmony among the audience.

The Chief Guest for the workshop was Ms. Sarla Manchanda, Vice President, AIWEFA. Dr. Renu Malaviya, Joint Secretary AIWEFA & Head, Department of Education, Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi was the Guest of Honour. The resource person for legal session was Adv. Shveta Gupta, Delhi Legal Services.

The workshop was inaugurated with auspicious lamp lighting ceremony. Welcome speech was given by Dr. Tania Gupta, Principal AIE. She congratulated the organization on celebrating their 90th anniversary this year. Ms. Sarla Manchanda delivered the opening remarks by talking about the importance of intergenerational bonding and the need for young adults to be sensitized on the relevance of family values.

The first session which was the technical session was conducted by Dr. Renu Malaviya, a distinguished Pedagogue and Mental Health Professional focused on the pivotal role of young adults to help the elderly. She also sensitized the students on helping the elderly with digitalization in order to make their lives easier and more comfortable. In her session she also elaborated on how young adults can learn plenty from the lives of their grandparents and can hone the art of listening to their

rich life experiences. The session was interactive and based on films, video presentations and group discussions.

The second session was the legal session which was conducted by Adv. Shveta Gupta who highlighted the rights and laws that an individual has as an elderly. She also enlightened the audience on the relevance of acceptance, love and respect across all generations and the need of the hour to value the family values, to sustain them and pass them onto the next generation through a video.

The third and the last session was all about evolving different strategies to bridge the intergenerational gap. The session drew to a close with the audience taking an oath to sensitize others in their immediate community about the issue.

Col B K Bhardwaj, Registrar, AIE delivered the vote of thanks, called for young adults to act as vigilance officers in their neighborhood to help the elderly.

The session struck a chord with the student-teachers as they promised to help the elderly in every manner possible and to help incorporate them into the fast moving world we are a part of. All participants were awarded certificate of participation by AIWEFA.
