WORKSHOP ON 'TRANSACTION ANALYSIS'

As a part of the Personality Development Programme, **Dr. Shruti Gupta, Deputy Director & Associate Professor (Human Resources), Army Institute of Management and Technology, Greater NOIDA,** conducted a session with the students on 21 Jan 2019. The focus was to give the students an insight about the term **Transactional Analysis**.

She explained to the students in details about the analysis as an approach to study interpersonal relations in an organizational system and made student teachers aware about a psychoanalytic theory wherein social transactions are analyzed to determine the various ego states of a person based on behavior. She discussed about the three ego states an individual switches himself into, i.e. parenting ego, adult ego, child ego. To introspect into the ego state, student teachers were motivated to complete the Transactional Analysis Questionnaire. Apart from that, she enlightened them with various other indispensable analyses such as script analysis, analysis of self-awareness, transactions and life positions.

It was an engaging and interesting session contributing immensely to the personality development of the students.
