## STREET PLAY COMPETITION FOR B.ED. BATCH 2019-21

Army Institute of Education, Greater Noida organized a Street Play competition for the student teachers of B.Ed Batch 2019-21 on Friday, 14th August, 2019 in Seminar hall. Street plays have been an integral part of Indian tradition. The idea of organizing Nukkad Natak at AIE was to spread awareness on social issues amongst student teachers and make them aware about the current social scenario. Four participating groups came up with sensitive topics, including Anti Ragging, Substance Abuse, Women Empowerment and Unity in Diversity.

Group I put forward their message on "Anti-Ragging". The student teachers took enthusiastic part in playing the different characters to highlight the physical and psychological trauma the new students go through in the process of ragging. Some incidents that come in the definition of ragging were highlighted through songs and actions. They touched the heart of audience by using Beat of Taali and expressive dialogues.




Figure 5 & 6 Simran Thapa, Kritika Bora, Monica Thapa,Bhawna,Abhilasha Chauhan,Sujata Kumari,Seema Devi, Bandana Joshi, Aarti Bosoya, Rajlaxmi Swain, Amrita Pramanik, Anshu Sharma, Neha Yadav, Amrita Rathi performing on the theme Women Empowerment
