The Army Institute of Education (AIE) had organised its first National Online-Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) Programme on October.7th.2023 Saturday, focusing on the topic of "NEP-2020: Empowering Teachers for Inclusive Education" from 10:00 AM-2:00 PM for 04 CRE points (23082320246760/2023-RCI). This initiative represents a significant step in positioning educational practices with the National Education Policy (NEP) of 2020, which emphasizes Inclusive Education and the holistic development of students as well as the educators. Following the welcome address, the rules and guidelines for the Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) Programme were stated. This step is crucial to ensure that participants are aware of the program's structure and expectations. The event featured a Saraswati Vandana, a traditional Hindu prayer dedicated to the goddess Saraswati, who is the symbol of knowledge, wisdom, and art. 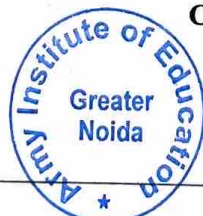
About AIE

To prepare multidisciplinary, competent, socially conscious, morally upright and technically skilled teachers with skill sets who act as a catalyst to shape the destiny of India.

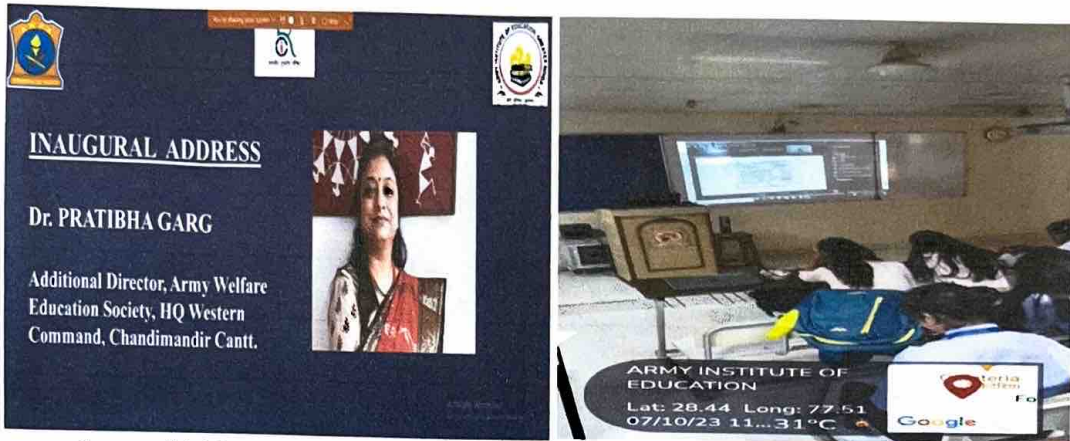

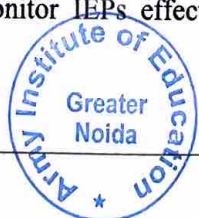

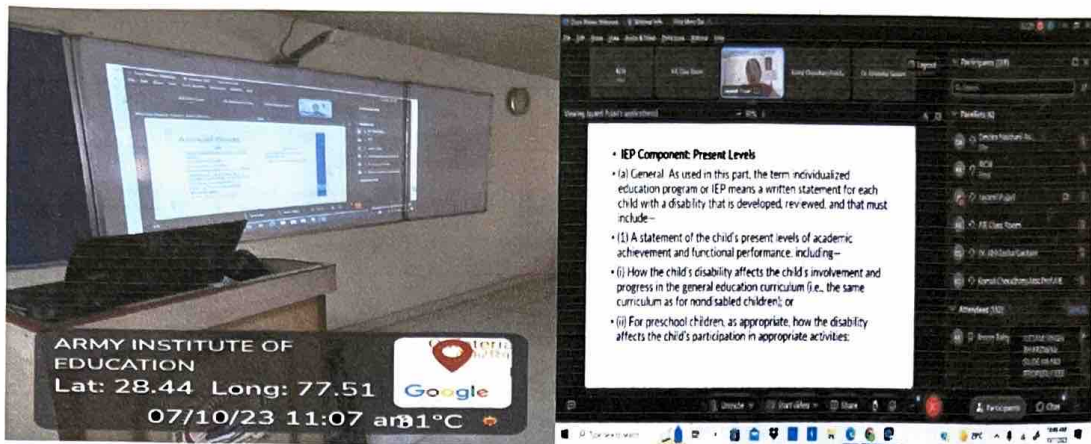
Session 1: "DESIGNING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF IEP (INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM)"

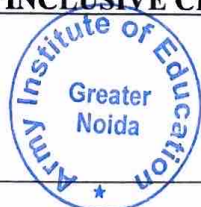
Session 2: "INTEGRATION OF TECHNOLOGY IN 21ST CENTURY INCLUSIVE EDUCATION CLASSROOM"

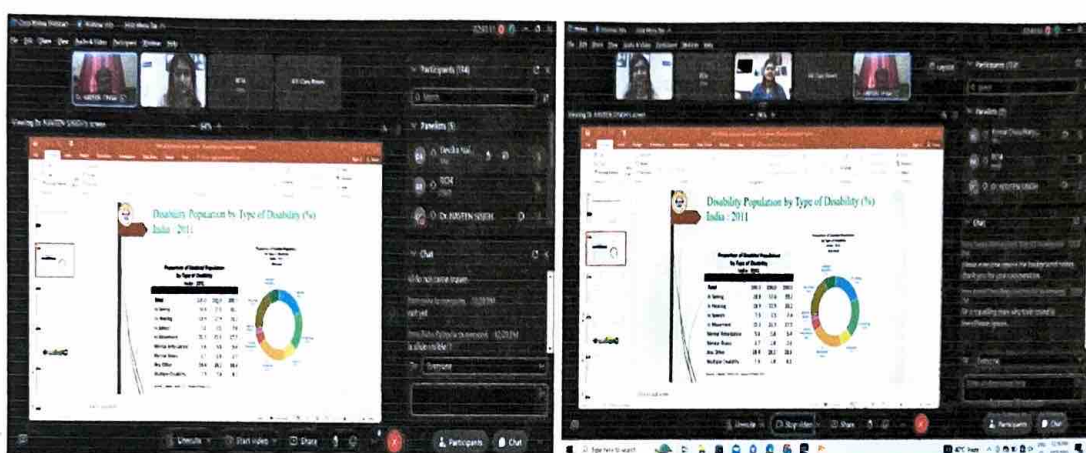

Session 4: “INNOVATIVE TEACHING PEDAGOGY FOR CREATING AN INCLUSIVE CLASSROOM”

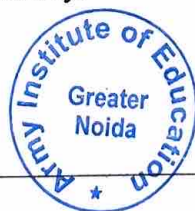

The CRE concluded with a rendition of the Indian National Anthem in Indian Sign Language, symbolizing unity and respect for the nation.

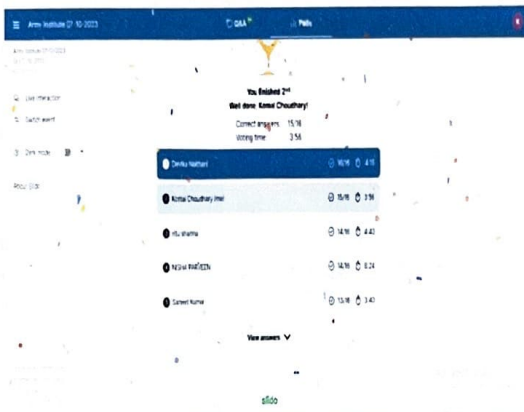

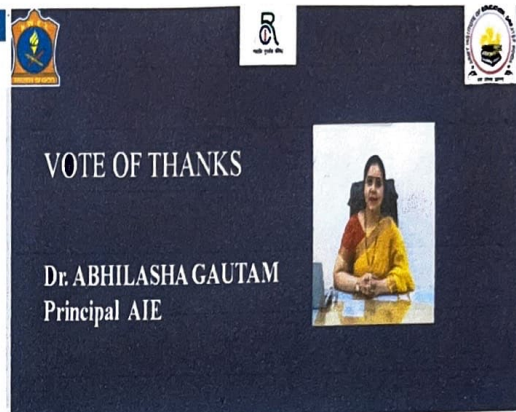

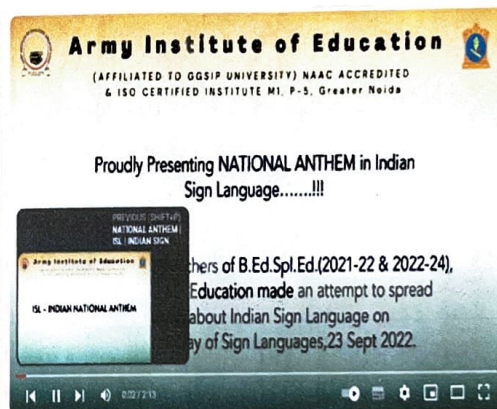
