


Opening Address by Maj Gen Bhavnish Kumar, VSM, COS Delhi Area & Chairman AIE and Welcome Address by Dr Abhilasha Gautam, Principal AIE



Address by Chief Guest, Prof (Dr) Mahesh Verma, Hon. VC, GGSIP University, New Delhi

**Prof (Dr) Mahesh Verma,** Padma Shri awardee, expressed his opinion on the subject and provided some observations, including the fact that India's economy remains steady both during and after the pandemic in comparison to other nations. Prof Verma suggested the gathering to plan, reorganise, and manoeuvre with vision from Covid to deal with a crisis. Regarding education, he claimed that the epidemic offered us access to greater technologies and elearning. He discussed health issues and how accessibility was handled throughout the pandemic. He argued that technology is the only solution. Prof Verma claimed that in order to improve society's economy, we must adhere to the three mantras of globalisation, liberation, and privatisation. The significance of the Sustainable Development Goals is important. He ended by appreciating the efforts of the Institute and gave novel acronym of AIE as Ace, Incredible and Essence.



#### Keynote Address by Mr Bradford Elliott, Vice President Investment Grade Credit Strategy Barclays, New York, USA and Dr Deepsha Agrawal, Doctor, Dept of Radiology, Oxford University Hospitals, UK

Mr Elliott discussed various issues of economy in perspective of pandemic. Dr Agrawal viewed health and education as the foundations of wellbeing. She informed us all of the opportunities and challenges that exist throughout the pandemic. Dr Agrawal presented five suggestions for reimagining post-pandemic civilization. the creation of digitally integrated national supply chains, the reform of medical education, data-driven health, and technology-driven health and the development of high-quality healthcare.



Keynote Address by Prof Kishor Kumar, ICCR Professor Chair (Indian Studies), Institute of Oriental Studies, Department of Languages and Cultures of India & South Asia, Jagiellonian University, Poland



The main point of his lecture was that just 2% of the country's GDP is spent on education, which means that health tourism must be regulated and under control. He discussed the value of student input and how innovation and critical thinking can advance society.



### Keynote Address by Mr Anuj Jain, Director, CMBS Strategy, Barclays, New York, USA, and Dr DK Gupta, Senior Consultant, General Adult Psychology, Institute of Mental Health, Singapore

Mr Jain educated us on the advantages of expansion and diversification in the commercial sector during the pandemic. He advised us to consider reinventing ourselves and provided a review of work from home opportunities and the growing usage of online communication. He added that women had more work prospects both during and after the pandemic.

Dr Gupta discussed neuropsychiatric symptoms, meta-analysis, and the need to improve mental health services. He also spoke about pandemic depression and cognitive decline. He presented a quick introduction to hybrid policies, economic recovery, and management.



Keynote Address by Prof (Dr) Aarti Srivastava, Vote of Thanks by Col Abhay Rajvanshi, Registrar & HoA, AIE

**Prof Srivastava** enlightened us with formal and informal education and job training. She talked about the value of teaching profession as it gives free and open space, protects social spaces and institutional spaces, sustainable technology, curriculum, etc. Prof Srivastava provides an overview of human capital in terms of health, education, and training as well as post-pandemic difficulties and advances in solidarity. It was an interactive event, and many lecturers and student teachers answered questions at the conclusion. The Inaugural session ended with the vote of thanks by Col Abhay Rajvanshi (Retd) Registrar AIE. He thanked the distinguished gathering for their presence and hoping that this platform will prove to be fruitful for further deliberations. ## **TECHNICAL SESSIONS**

The technical sessions followed the inaugural session and the main keynote lecture. The international conference comprised of three technical sessions of Online and Offline. Each session had a Chair and Co-chair, who were experts in the domain. Each author was given 5 minutes for the paper presentation, which was followed by question and answer session for 3 minutes. The conference was structured to foster discussion between participants.

## **TECHNICAL SESSION: 1**

**Dr Vinod Kumar Shanwal**, **Associate Professor**, **USE**, **GGSIP University**, **New Delhi**, chaired this technical session I. The technical session had 17 papers. Dr Shanwal opened his remarks by congratulating the International Conference's organisers and the paper speakers on their work. He highlighted how COVID has affected education and how it has opened up new avenues for learning. Ms Santosh Dutt and Ms Nitya Saini, Student teachers of B.Ed. Batch 2021-23 anchored the technical session I.

Some of the papers presented in Technical Session 1 were based on MOOC (Massive Open Online Courses) programmes. They highlighted the importance and relevance for better academic outcomes. There are certain problems since there is a significant difference between the rates of enrolment and course completion.



Few papers discussed the impact on the students' and teachers' (adolescent) mental health. How tough it was for the teachers to teach from home because several of them were also mothers at the time and found it difficult to teach online. The students also suffered since they were forced to interact socially just within the confines of the home.

Another topic discussed was the use of creative teaching methods. The way online education has inspired many teachers to incorporate the various technology at their disposal into their teaching methods. Inclusion can be achieved through digital equity.

Remaining papers were concerned on how Covid-19 has impacted the Indian and the world economy. They also suggested ways on India how can become one of the economic leaders in the world.


## **TECHNICAL SESSION 3**



IQAC and Research and Development Cell of AIE organised One Day Education Conclave 2022, "Innovative Pedagogical Practices in Light of NEP 2020" in collaboration with Council for Teacher Education Foundation (CTEF) & Social Development and Research Foundation (SDRF)

on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2022 from 9:30 am to 4:00 pm. Objective of this conclave was to create awareness about innovative pedagogical practices as per National Education Policy 2020 amongst teachers, students and, other stakeholders of education as per organizations. NEP 2020 envisions nurturing innovation in all domains of education and recommends the need to innovate in all fields of education. The skill to think and to innovate is a desirable 21st century skill from the students. He concluded with an insight on how a teacher should behave like a researcher with an aim to benefit the society at large.



Afterwards, distinguished speaker, Prof. Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Program Director Social Development & Research Foundation, Secretary General, Principal, Saraswati College of professional studies Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh. He started his speech on "Skills: Status and Opportunities" with the historical background of computer & internet. He told about the importance of digital transformation in various sectors of India. He also discussed about use of digital skills in rural areas. In addition to that, he talked about good face, bad face and, ugly face of digital skills. He presented statistics of Internet availability as 42% in Urban and 15% in Rural areas. He stressed on immediate need to transform traditional teachers into digital teachers and to combine digital skills with core principles of teaching and learning. He also shared UDISE Report – 2019-20 and few impact stories on power of collaborative work "Internet Saath". He concluded his speech by deliberating on digital era and how to be competitive but, by being sure of authenticity of anything and everything.

In post lunch session eminent resource person Prof. Dr. Satyendra Gupta, President Council for Teacher Education Foundation, Delhi- NCR chapter professor & Dean School of Education Galgotias University, Greater Noida Uttar Pradesh. He deliberated on the topic "National Mission for Mentoring." He started his talk by explaining three terms, National, Mission and Mentoring. He told about importance of mentorship at national level. Second speaker of post lunch session Mrs. Meeta Bhandula, Principal, Jaypee Public School, Greater Noida Certified Global Career Counsellor shared her valuable thoughts on the topic "Design Thinking and AI – A New Dimension to Teaching". She told about the five stage process of design thinking as empathize, define, ideate, prototype and, test. She also discussed about the use of Artificial Intelligent in education. She talked about top fifteen skills for 2025 and how design thinking prepares students to succeed in life. She apprised the audience with new terms like Augmented reality and Virtual reality.

Dr. Babita Bhardwaj, Convener, Assistant Professor, AIE presented a report on the key highlights of education conclave 2022 and proposed vote of thanks for this successful conclave.






Figure 7 Dr Babita Bhardwaj proposing vote of thanks

period of time. The objective of the workshop was to raise awareness about IPRs among student-teachers and teachers to utilize their academic contributions in a more effective manner.





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## WORKSHOP ON INDIAN SIGN LANGUAGE

As we are celebrating INTERNATIONAL DAY OF INDIAN SIGN LANGUAGE 2022, as part of the ongoing activities a workshop was organised by Inclusive Education Centre and NSS cell of Army Institute of Education, Greater Noida on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022. The workshop aimed to encourage awareness about sign language as our honourable Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that for the first time in the country, sign language is being included as a subject in academic curriculum. 





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# Report on workshop Understanding HIV/AIDS: Let's break the stigma on 5th Dec 2022

Keeping in view the global threat which HIV/AIDS have become & on occasion of World Aids Day, a workshop on understanding HIV/AIDS : let's break the stigma was conducted by Army Institute of Education, Greater Noida on 5th Dec 2022. The resource person for the guest lecture was Miss Dipika, a young transgender activist who has dedicated her 13 years to the community since 2009. She has worked with several community-based organisations and has made contributions to Pehchan, India's largest community programme was our resource person on the same topic. Initially in the workshop, Miss Dipika discussed about HIV/AIDS and emphasized that this disease is rampantly been on rise especially in the developing countries like India. She discussed the severity of the condition and common misconceptions about it, such as the fact that it is contagious and that those who have it must live in seclusion. She spoke about causes of HIV/AIDS, provided various examples and discussed the conditions that contributed to its expansion. She gave us valuable information on the legal rights that people with this sickness have. also She talked about numerous ways to enhance feeling of inclusiveness of these people in the society.

She briefly mentioned the LGBTQ population and the types of prejudice that group faces since they do not meet the stereotypical definitions of male and female gender. In accordance with the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Bill, 2019 a transgender person is one whose gender does not correspond to the sex assigned at birth. It encompasses those who identify as transgender, intersex, genderqueer, and with socio-cultural identities like kinnar and hijra. She also spoke about various instances from her life in which, as a trans woman, she had been the target of several abuses and that her family had not provided her with the necessary assistance. The session was really engaging and interactive with the resource person very graciously answering all of them & clarifying many of the attendees' misunderstandings and was highly enlightening.

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
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# 3 Days Webinar Series on "Rashtriya Poshan Maah" Held on 27-29 Sep 2022
